Our approach is built on the **fundamental right** of every person to control their own body, receive inclusive care, and have the knowledge and support to make informed decisions about their sexual and reproductive health.

This commitment is the foundation of our work, our DNA, shaping how we care, how we advocate, and how we partner with communities.

The coming decade brings persistent and emerging challenges: misinformation, stigma, inequity, and political threats to sexual and reproductive rights.

In this context, SHINE SA's **focus on empowered communities, equitable access to integrated care**, and a **rights-protective** policy environment positions us to drive **meaningful population impact**.

Our work **prioritises** those experiencing the **greatest barriers** to sexual and reproductive health, including Aboriginal communities, LGBTIQ+ people, young people, people with disability, and culturally and racially marginalised communities.

Our **commitment to reconciliation** means we listen to and learn from Aboriginal communities, ensuring their voices and cultural knowledge guide our work. Our **strong commitment to LGBTIQ+ inclusion**, alongside focus on other communities of interest, ensures services, governance, and advocacy **reflect and respect diversity** in sexual, gender, cultural, racial, and bodily experience.

Through these priorities and enablers, SHINE SA will continue to **protect rights, strengthen systems**, and contribute to a future where sexual and reproductive health and rights are universal, upheld, and celebrated.

We envision a health system where every person can access safe, respectful, integrated care, wherever they live and whatever barriers they face.

By 2030, SHINE SA will:

- Deliver trauma-informed, culturally safe, and inclusive healthcare that affirms autonomy and choice.
- Expand statewide access through digital care, outreach, partnerships, and innovative models.
- Strengthen coordination with primary care, specialist services, and community organisations to ensure seamless pathways.
- Be recognised as South Australia's centre of excellence in sexual and reproductive health practice, training, and innovation.



Strategic Priority 3

A Policy and Community Environment that **Protects** and **Advances** Sexual and Reproductive **Health and Rights**

We envision a society where rights are protected, harmful narratives are challenged, and decision-makers are guided by evidence and lived experience.

By 2030, SHINE SA will:

-  Advocate for policy, legislative, and system reforms that protect access, autonomy, and equity.
-  Build partnerships, amplify community leadership, and challenge discrimination and exclusion.
-  Promote accurate, rights-based narratives that dismantle stigma and counter misinformation.
-  Influence policy and practice using evidence, expertise, and lived experience.
