Syphilis is becoming more and more common in South Australia.

Syphilis is a sexually transmitted infection (STI) spread when you have sex with someone who has the infection.

If untreated, syphilis can damage the brain, vision, heart, veins, liver, bones, muscles and joints. Syphilis in pregnancy can harm babies.

You should have a syphilis test if you've had sex without a condom. You should also have a test if you're having sex with more than one person, you've been diagnosed with another STI or you have a sexual partner who's been told they have an STI.

It's a good idea to get a regular STI test if you're sexually active.
